## **Read Write Inc. Phonics**

At St Joseph's, we believe reading to be a very important part of children's learning and, as part of our work to improve outcomes for pupils, we have changed to Read Write Inc which is the market leader in teaching children to read. We chose this particular programme because it:

- is rooted in synthetic phonics.
- has been tried and tested over and over again
- is systematic, structured and therefore results in rapid teaching and learning of sounds and blending.
- means that, importantly and simply, when children know these sounds well and they can blend, they read books that are carefully matched to the sounds they know, which means that children are successful from the very beginning!

Although we already had a number of RWI resources in school we have recently been able to order extensive new resources to support the reading books that go home. We have been able to purchase these resources by applying for and being given a grant of £1300, the remainder of Mrs Hobart's sponsored bicycle ride and some of the money that we received from the sale of Bernadette Winsor's wardrobe.

In addition to the phonics workshop we ran in the autumn term, we would like to invite you to a parents' meeting to update you on our new approach to teaching phonics and to observe a phonics lesson. We have two opportunities for parents to attend:

# **Internet-enabled Christmas gifts**

The NAHT have suggested five tips for parents whose children have received internet-enabled gifts, so that they are as 'switched on'



as possible when they talk to their children:

- Make sure your children feel confident they can come to you if they need help or are unsure about anything that happens online.
- Have open and open regular conversations with your children about technology and their use of it. Agree a set of family rules, including around screen time.
- Check the capabilities of the devices your child uses including toys. Does it have internet access? Can it be used to communicate with others?
- Be aware of and follow the age requirements of many social media apps and games.
- Find out what safety tools or parental controls are available, and set them up as appropriate. For younger children, supervise their use.
