The Mustard Seed Day is an opportunity to encourage and affirm our pupils in their God-given potential and allow each of them to explore how uniquely special they are.


The day culminates in a performance at 2.30 pm to which all parents and carers are welcome to attend.

Lent is a time for reconciliation and growing closer to God. It is a time for doing something positive and, as is our Catholic tradition, the children and staff will focus on:




Prayer— to allow God the space to grow in us and speak to us.
