### Attendance

Attendance is one of our highest priorities at St Joseph's. Attendance which is even slightly low




can impact on your child's learning and social skills as well as whole school outcomes.

Attendance below 95% is too low and below 90% is known as 'Persistent Absence'. This can lead to Local Authority intervention. Coughs and colds are very common in school, but should not be a reason to keep your child at home. It is better to send them into school - we will always call home if your child is very unwell.

Evidence shows that pupils with good attendance are both more academically and socially secure. Getting to school on time also means that pupils are settled in class and don't miss the start of their learning.

Please help your child with their learning in Physical Education by ensuring that

they have the correct PE kit in school every day of the week.



#### **Accelerated Reader**

Over the last couple of years we have been using Accelerated Reading (AR) as a tool to support our teaching of reading. AR is not our only tool in the teaching of reading, and neither is it our only way of assessing children's reading.

As you would expect, we are constantly reviewing our teaching and pupils' learning to ensure we are confident that children are enjoying their reading, making good progress and achieving well.

Encouraging a love for reading is key to children reading widely and often, with fluency and comprehension, and our monitoring tells us that our children's love for reading could be better developed. As a result, we are reviewing our approach to the use of AR to ensure that it is as effective as possible in supporting our teaching of reading. Feedback from pupils tells us that the quizzing has become more important to them than the reading, and the love of reading is coming second to the love of quizzing, with children often picking short books so that they can quiz more often. Quizzing does not teach children, it just gives an indication of their comprehension of what they are reading, and there are many ways that teachers can get this information.

All children currently using AR will continue to do so. Teachers complete STAR tests at intervals over the year as one way to measure progress. All children completed a STAR test at the beginning of the school year and will take another one over the next couple of weeks. After their second STAR test, quizzing will be suspended until the third STAR test is taken in the Spring Term. Children will continue to read within their ZPD range, and class teachers will continue to teach reading through class and guided reading lessons. This will all be explained to the children by their teachers in the coming weeks.

During the period of quizzing being suspended, we will continue to work with pupils to promote a love of reading and ensure that good progress and achievement is secured. We will make a decision about the possible re-launch of quizzing in the Spring Term. If you have any concerns about your child's reading, their love of reading, or their achievement, please see your child's class teacher.
