Swimming Being a town close to the coast, we are aware of the importance of children learning to swim. In addition to the statutory curriculum time, we ensure that all KS2 children have extended termly swimming opportunities. This will support our aim for 100% success at the end of Y6 in swimming 25m with confidence and mean that the children can access the local free opportunities of sea swimming with their families - safely.
