One Million Children Praying the Rosary—18th October

Yesterday, St Joseph's pupils joined one million children in thirty eight countries around the world in praying the Holy Rosary.

We prayed particularly for personal peace and family peace,

as well as unity and peace throughout the world.

The word "rosary" originally meant "crown of roses," which is a symbol of the Virgin Mary. A rosary is a string of beads divided into five groups of ten beads

by one bead, with a strand of five beads and a crucifix that hang from the bottom. Each bead has prayers that go along with it. These prayers focus on the life of Jesus.

Packed Lunches

We have recently become concerned about the amount of food waste collected from packed lunches. Our concern is two fold:

- 1. Children are not eating the lunch that their parents have prepared. This means that they may be going into class without the benefit of a healthy and nutritious lunch to see them through the afternoon's learning. It is also a waste of parents' money and time.
- 2. The amount of waste the school is creating is avoidable and can be reduced. This supports our pupils' work on Pope Francis' encyclical, Laudato Si', a profound invitation to everyone on the planet to care for our common home.

For these reason we will ensure that all uneaten food and waste, within reason, will be kept in the lunchbox and returned home with the child so that parents are able to monitor their child's food consumption.




Attendance is monitored carefully by the school and Devon.
